Overview

For this 6-credit course, students will use a case study approach to conduct research on problems addressing the Danube Delta and Black Sea Coast in Romania. The course will cover multi-disciplinary issues and integrate Natural Science, Socioeconomic Conditions and Public Policy Issues. This research project will be highly interactive, utilizing workshops, seminars, and technology training.

Dates: July 17 – August 18, 2006 (In Romania July 22-August 18)

Credits: 3 undergraduate credits in Conservation and Environmental Science; and 3 credits in Anthropology

Participation: Open to all US college/university students. Preference given to UWM students.

Estimated Cost: \$3,050*

* Program fees are based on a realistic estimate of participants. The cost may change if the exchange rate fluctuates or the minimum number of participants is not achieved. This cost does not include airfare or meals.
