The scholarship provides 2000-3500 (Euro)/month plus additional allowance for accompanying family members, travel expenses and German language instruction. The German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) offers Graduate Scholarships to highly qualified graduate students, Ph.D. candidates and post-doctoral researchers for

study and/or research at universities or institutes in the Federal Republic of Germany. This scholarship provides funds for study and/or research in Germany for 1 to 10 months between October 1, 2004 and July 31, 2005 (PhD applicants who wish to apply for the February-July 2005 period should submit their application by August 1st, 2004). The scholarship is open to graduate students pursuing their masters or doctorate for study and/or research prior to completing their degree. Students are particularly encouraged to apply for support to participate in a Masters program in Germany. For a full degree course in Germany, the study scholarship can also be awarded for up to 24 months. Initially, scholarships for a full degree course in Germany are awarded for one academic year and can be extended for students with good study achievements to cover the full length of the chosen degree course. Recent Ph.D. recipients (up to two years after the completion of the degree) may also apply to pursue post-doctoral research at libraries, archives, institutes or laboratories. DAAD—GERMAN ACADEMIC EXCHANGE SERVICE

Young Lawyers Program

The fellowship offers the opportunity to gain unique insight into the structure and function of German law during an eight-month study/practical training visit to the Federal Republic. The course, designed for a small group of international participants, is open to applicants from the United Kingdom, France, Belgium, the Netherlands, Luxembourg, Poland, the Commonwealth of Independent States, Japan, South Korea, the United States, and Canada. ERASMUS SCHOLARSHIPS.

The European Union has announced an ambitious scholarship program that will allow 2,000 students from outside the region to study in two-year master's programs in Europe at any one time. The program, called Erasmus World, will have a budget of about \$200-million for an initial phase of four academic years, starting in the Fall of 2004. Some 4,200 foreign students are to receive scholarships during that period, as the program gradually works up to full capacity. Candidates will apply directly to European universities, which will recommend a number of them for the scholarships. A Europe-wide commission will then make the final choices. Students chosen for scholarships will have their full costs covered, including airfare to Europe, tuition, and a living stipend averaging \$1,600 per month.

EUROPEAN MOLECULAR BIOLOGY ORGANIZATION: LONG TERM FELLOWSHIPS

PURPOSE:

Annual program to support postdoctoral scholars in a stay of 12 to 24 months for advanced training in a laboratory located in one of the participating European countries. The fellowship is intended for scientists early in their career.

The IDRF awards enable doctoral candidates of proven achievement and outstanding potential to use their knowledge of distinctive cultures, societies, languages, economies, politics, and histories, in combination with their disciplinary training, to address issues that transcend their disciplines or area specializations. The program supports scholarship that treats place and setting in relation to broader phenomena as well as in particular historical and cultural contexts.

Standard fellowships will provide support for nine to twelve months in the field, plus travel expenses. They will rarely exceed \$20,000. In some cases, the candidate may propose fewer than nine months of overseas fieldwork, but no award will be given for fewer than six months.
